South Boston saw more than its fair share of shamrocks and shivers Sunday, as participants in Harpoon's 7th annual Shamrock Splash plunged into the icy waters at M Street Beach to support local beaches.

Organizer Bruce Berman said 170 people registered for the event, which raises

funds to benefit Save The Harbor/Save The Bay; those in attendance had the option of sticking around after their swim for a beer and a "post-splash meal" (a brunch burrito and a cup of chowder). Though some proceeds are yet to be tallied, the group raised over \$48,641, according to the event's website.
